



Antje Schupp is a director, performer, writer and lecturer. Her artistic praxis is shaped by the variety of productions she's been creating—performances, dance projects, site specific works, operas, plays—in total +70 productions. She is interested in political, ecological and social topics and combines different stylistic elements to create multi-layered narratives. She studied directing at the Theatre Academy in Munich, creating productions at Kaserne Basel, Schauspielhaus Zürich, Neumarkt Theater or Burgtheater Vienna a.o., performing at festivals such as Zürcher Theater Spektakel, Politik im Freien Theater, Berliner Theatertreffen, Antigel Geneva, Impulse Festival. She regularly works in international collaborations, e.g. in South Africa, Lebanon, Kosovo or Brasil.

Antje Schupp received the Festspielpreis Zurich 2020, the Lenz-Prize for Dramatic Arts 2021 as well as the Swiss Performing Arts Award 2021: "In every one of her works, the open-minded curiosity with which she tackles weighty and often difficult topics conveys itself to the audience, enabling her to be highly political without being moralising."

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Dimitri de Perrot uses sound as a central theatrical narrative means. With his spatial productions, he guides the audience towards an in-depth listening experience, based on the conviction that hearing and the ability to listen are an essential foundation for any form of coexistence and peaceful community. It is a skill that needs to be practised and cultivated again and again so that it can unfold. Listening takes time and an inner availability; by giving our time, we offer ourselves the possibility of an encounter, a discovery—listening is the beginning of understanding and change.

Dimitri de Perrot is a musician, stage designer, director and sound artist. He creates productions and sound installations for theatres, museums and public spaces, in which he subtly and poetically introduces the audience to listening to outer and inner worlds: "Dimitri de Perrot questions with great agility the boundaries between individuals. He succeeds in the feat of creating a collective, even though he mobilises our most personal interpretations." *La Terrasse*



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Rebecca Weingartner is a Swiss-Hongkong-Chinese choreographer, born in Seoul, based in Basel. The awareness of structural disadvantages Rebecca Weingartner experienced herself as a woman*, person of color as well as a person affected by classism drive her current artistic exploration. Currently, she is working on the final piece of a trilogy focusing on young audience. In 2021, Rebecca Weingartner was awarded the culture price for dance by the government of Canton Baselland.

Company Rebecca Weingartner is a freelance company for contemporary dance based in Basel. The company's aim is to produce multi-layered dance pieces that address socially relevant issues and reflect on them with humor and depth in a highly accessible manner. It is a particular concern of the company to reach out to younger or inexperienced as well as experienced audiences with their pieces.

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Criptonite is a queer-crip dance and theatre project by Zurich-based artists Nina Mühlemann and Edwin Ramirez, which was founded in 2020. In their work, Criptonite centre disabled artists and use access as a central part of their aesthetic. Their work explores slow animals, superheroes, self-empowerment, pleasure as a form of resistance or life in symbiosis. Criptonite's co-production partners are Gessnerallee Zurich and Tanzhaus Zurich. Criptonite was included in the 2020-2022 selection by the Freischwimmen network and had residencies at Hoch X Munich and Brut Vienna, and toured in Munich at the Freischwimmen Festival and the Sophiensaele Berlin. In 2022, Criptonite received the Cultural Award in the theatre category from the City of Zurich. In 2023, the collective was selected by the City of Zurich for a 4-year concept funding grant. In September 2024 Criptonite is organising a lab for disabled artists at Gessnerallee Zurich. Their next piece "Bioluminescence" will premiere at Tanzhaus Zurich in summer 2025.



Piet Baumgartner is an experienced visual artist. He directs for film and theater. He is interested in people, machines and emotions. Piet likes to work collaboratively, for example with the musician Rio Wolta or with the theater maker Julia Reichert.

His production "EWS" about the biggest political scandal in the Swiss parliament was named best play of the year. 

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Lea Moro has been working as a choreographer, curator, dramaturge and project manager in the cultural sector for over ten years. Her choreographic work has gained national and international recognition, including projects for various age groups. In 2020 she founded the platform "Work it Out". She has extensive qualifications, including further training in systemic organisational consulting (Humboldt University Berlin), curating in the scenic arts (Paris Lodron University Salzburg), a master's degree in development and cooperation (NADEL/ETH Zurich), and a certificate in sustainability management (Institute for Future Culture and Aktionsnetzwerk Germany). 


